Since the first edition that took place in 2011, courses have been progressively modified to comply with the suggestions of participants and teachers.

This year again, the Neurosonology course will gather teachers and members of both our SSCN and SSUM. Dr. G. Kägi and Prof. P. Lyrer organize an attractive course that complies with the rules of the two Societies.

- to prepare for the annual exams;
- to give the opportunity to teachers and experts to exchange with participants;
- to discuss and possibly standardize teaching methods and requirements in Switzerland.

### **Language**

Courses are held in English to accommodate the majority of participants.

### **Lunches**

Participants and faculty will be welcomed at the restaurants of the Inselspital for the lunches (cost included in the application fee).

### **Cost (unchanged since the first Academy in 2011)**

- CHF 300 for SSCN and SSUM members, for residents having undertaken the formalities to become members of the SSCN;
- CHF 600 for non-members of the SSCN or SSUM.

### **Certificate**

Participants and faculty members remaining during the course will receive a **certificate of attendance** attesting of **16 credits / course**.
